Dear Jimmy:

I am enclosing copy of a letter I have written to Henry Iba concerning the backboards and the balls.

I have also notified Professor Russell Wiley, director of the University of Kansas Band, about the time it takes for your illumination performance. He is planning his between-half entertainment as follows:

- (1) Gun spinning act - by Billy Sears and George Rhodes - time: about $2\frac{1}{2}$ minutes. All lights should be on for this.
- (2) Display of electric lighted batons by the drum major staff of the Band - Billy Sears, George Rhodes, James Berkson, Dorothy Nicholson, Robert Woolverton, and Robert Bellamy - time: 6 minutes. All lights should be off for this performance. About $\frac{1}{2}$ minute should elapse from the time the boys in the first act leave the floor until the lights go off.
- (3) Illumination spectacle - with musical background by the band.
