As usual, the Big Six Conference is closing its final basketball race with two teams deedlocked for first position. Oklahoma scored a thrilling upset victory over Iowa State College at Ames, Iowa, on Monday night by a score of 44 to 50, sending the Sconers to a first place position over the Iowa State Cyclones. Oklahoma has closed her season in the conference by winning 9 games and losing 1, while Iowa State College has won 8 and lost 1. The important game on the Iowa State Cyclone's schedule is with the University of Kansas here in Hoch Auditorium Friday night, March 3, at 7:50 p.m.

It will be necessary for Conch Louis Hense's team to defeat Kensas to finish in a tie deedlock with the Oklahoma Sconers for a first place position. A win for low State will give them 9 genes won and 1 lost, thereby tying up Dig Six honors. However, it will be necessary for Iowa State to defeat Kansas to be the Dig Six representative team in the Western National Collegiate Athletic Association play-off which will be held in Hansas City's Municipal Auditorium March 24 and 25. A rule was passed by the Big Six Conference before Pearl Harbor to the effect that when two or more teams are tied for first place position, the team with the better offensive-defensive ratio record shall be the team representing the Big Sin Conference in the NOAA play-off. Iowa State and Kansas tied for first place in 1941, but Iowa State had the better offensive-defensive ratio record; therefore, Iowa State was the representative team in the tournament. Iowa State played Creighton University, Creighton being the Missouri Valley representative for the right to represent this district. Creighton won, thereby being the Fifth District representative. The Fifth District has two strong conferences - the Big Six Conference and the Missouri Valley Conference, - and comprises the states of Kunsas, Missouri, Oklahom, Iows and Mebraska, There are four collegiate districts west of the Mississippi Niver, the Fifth being our area, the Sixth the Southwest Conference area, the Seventh the Rocky Mountain Area, and the Sighth the Pacific Coast area. Likewise, there are four collegiate districts east of the Mississippi River - the New
