The teams that suffer most are the one which observe the conference rules. The big time teams have discarded all of the traditional collegiate restrictions. There is no one at present in the collegiate set up to enforce the old rules. Maybe they are outmoded. The big timers are ignering these rules the same as Hitler ignered the Versailles treaty and invaded the Ruhr. No nation acted,— and no school or person is restricting the big time teams and the big time coaches the force.

The surest way to kill intercollegiate athletics for the future is to continue in the deplorable manner that they are now being conducted. 

The only safe way to insure their continuance on a safe and high plane, bringing back the fine educational phases of years gone by, is the installation of a High Commissioner or czar. A sterling character the like of Commissioner Kenesaw Mountain Landis would do the trick.
