

Dear doc-

Many times I've thought that I must get a letter off to you thanking you for sending Jayhawk Rebounds. This is it. I certainly appreciate your thoughtfulness and admire you for the great amount of effort it must take to get an issue out to the lads. Like many of the letters I read in Rebounds I haven't come across any KU men. Wrote Paul Harrington one day months ago but haven't heard anything from him.

In the 26 July 1944 issue Lt. John Pfitzsch said he met a Remy (Bill). I wish I could say that it was the same one who is writing to you but I can't lay any such claim, unfortunately. In the first place I'm not in the air corps even though I've tried since my arrival in England over 2 years ago. I'm just a blankety-blank Quartermaster - Subsistence Officer, whose work is no more exciting than going to the corner grocery to buy tomorrow's meals. There aren't many Purple Hearts in the QMC!

Now that the European war is on its last legs we in the U.K. are wondering whether it will be home via New York or San Francisco. Especially those of us with long overseas service and a family to boot. Some people can't seem to realize that absence from one's family is as tough as being in combat. I'd like to have a chance at it if it means getting out sooner. Best of luck.

Dear Harold:

Yes, we are planning on some games in Kansas City. I have written Rookhurst for the 12th of December, but have not heard from them.

We are also planning games for the 15th and 16th of December, and the 22nd and 23rd of December. Kansas may not play in the 15th and 16th games, and yet there is a possibility they might. But for the 22nd and 23rd we will have Missouri, Kansas State, Kansas, perhaps Colorado, and some other team as Colorado can only play one game.

For the 15th and 16th - neither date is closed entirely, but Oklahoma and the Iowa Seahawks will play one game, and we may have Wyoming and some other team to fill in the other games. They are tentative and I will ask you to keep it confidential, but you can rather plan on the 12th, if possible, and the 22nd and 23rd. I am sure we can arrange something for those dates, and we might on the 15th and 16th. I will advise you when we get further along.

Our basketball prospects are not alluring, but we will take them in stride and hope to get going before the season is over.

I trust to see your game in Lawrence Friday night.
