Dear Jim:

Surprise would be putting it mildly when we found that you had left the University without permission. There is a definite University rule that no member of the faculty shall leave the campus under such conditions as you left, unless you have the written permission from the Chancellor.

I have been advised by the administration that your salary warrant for the first half of June has been ordered cancelled for the reason that you were not here in person to earn it.

I regret to advise you that your salary voucher check for May has been held up. And that it can not be released until you mail your personal check for thirty five dollars payable to the University of Kansas. This thirty five dollars totals the amount unearned by your absenting yourself from your work beginning May 23, 1941.

Another regretable incident was the fact that you turned in grades for some of our Varsity baseball players without consulting me. You interviewed Ralph Dugan in regard to this. He was a student assistant helping me with my freshmen and not with my Varsity.
