have a student check often than merely attend classes and not discuss their lesson after class.

I want to assure you, Mrs. Reid, that I do know what it means to have Bruce play basketball, and I want you to know that the other day I assured him we were counting on him for the warsity this year. Personally, I think he is a little worried because I told the boys a couple of weeks ago that if any of them were doing failing work when the mid-semester reports came in that I would drop them from the squad until they could bring their work up to passing. This may account for his nervousness because he might feel that would be some embarrassment.

However, I am taking a very personal interest in this matter and you can count on my loyalty to him in doing for him what you would want to have done.

I am always very happy to a letter from a parent, and I assure you that I have spent quite some time very pleasantly. I would say, in working this thing out to a conclusion that I have very great confidence will turn out satisfactorily for all concerned. I will advise you further and make a progress report. In the meantime, you can rest assured that we are doing everything consistent with your desires and Bruce's best interests.
