I know we would pay your expenses, even if I would have to personally pay it myself. I have been endeavoring to keep in the background from a basketball standpoint, but there are certain things that I can do myself that are my own business. So I dislike to ask for expenditures for basketball. I am going to put it over and put it over in a big way, but with the depleted condition of the athletic treasury, and by the way, it doesn't look like we are getting along any better financially, and we are spending a lot more money, so you see the reason for my reticence in asking for expenditures.



When you get to town call me at Circle 7-2292.


I will be in the west practically all of August.


