Memo to the Chancellor:

In running over the possible faculty personnel who might assist us in our Conditioning Course, these men come to my mind: R. H. Beamer, D. D. Haines, H. B. Ivy, W. H. Shoemaker, Raymond Nichols, Gilbert Ulmer, Guy Keeler, Fred Montgomery, Dean Moreau, Dean Reece, Captain Smith.

I can now think of their regular University assignments that each of these men have and I see the utter impossibility of calling upon them for a sustained schedule. Therefore, I feel that the only possible solution to a fairly successful schedule will be the recruiting of all of our physical education majors who have this special aptitude, and also calling on other mature varsity athletic men who can constitute a squad who will, of necessity, receive special training prior to their instructional work. This special training will be done, of course, by our own staff of Mr. Shenk, Dr. Morehouse, Mr. Replogle and myself.

I emphasize the necessity of using Wayne Replogle because I can visualize the possibility where he might feel his duties are to his freshmen first. I am not speaking of his training the freshman football team, but rather he may feel that his mornings belong to the freshmen. It is in the mornings that we desire to use him and I will thank you if you will see that we are permitted to have him.
