I am enclosing a letter from the J. B. Miller Keyless Lock Company, the makers of the old locks that are now on the baskets in the women's locker room. These old locks have been on the baskets for several years, and have been unused because we have been unable to remove them by using the combinations.

You will see from Mr. McGarry's letter that if we can get these locks off and send them in to this company that they will allow us 10¢ on each lock, on the purchase of new locks.

The new locks are priced 90¢, 80¢ and 75¢ each (this does not include the trade-in allowance). It is our desire to buy 500 - 600 of these locks and let the students purchase them, but of course do not have a fund set aside for this. How do you suggest that the matter be handled?
