My dear Phog:


I had a big laugh over your letter of April twelfth. You certainly came through in big style. I tryed a little of that on my feet and it worked fine.

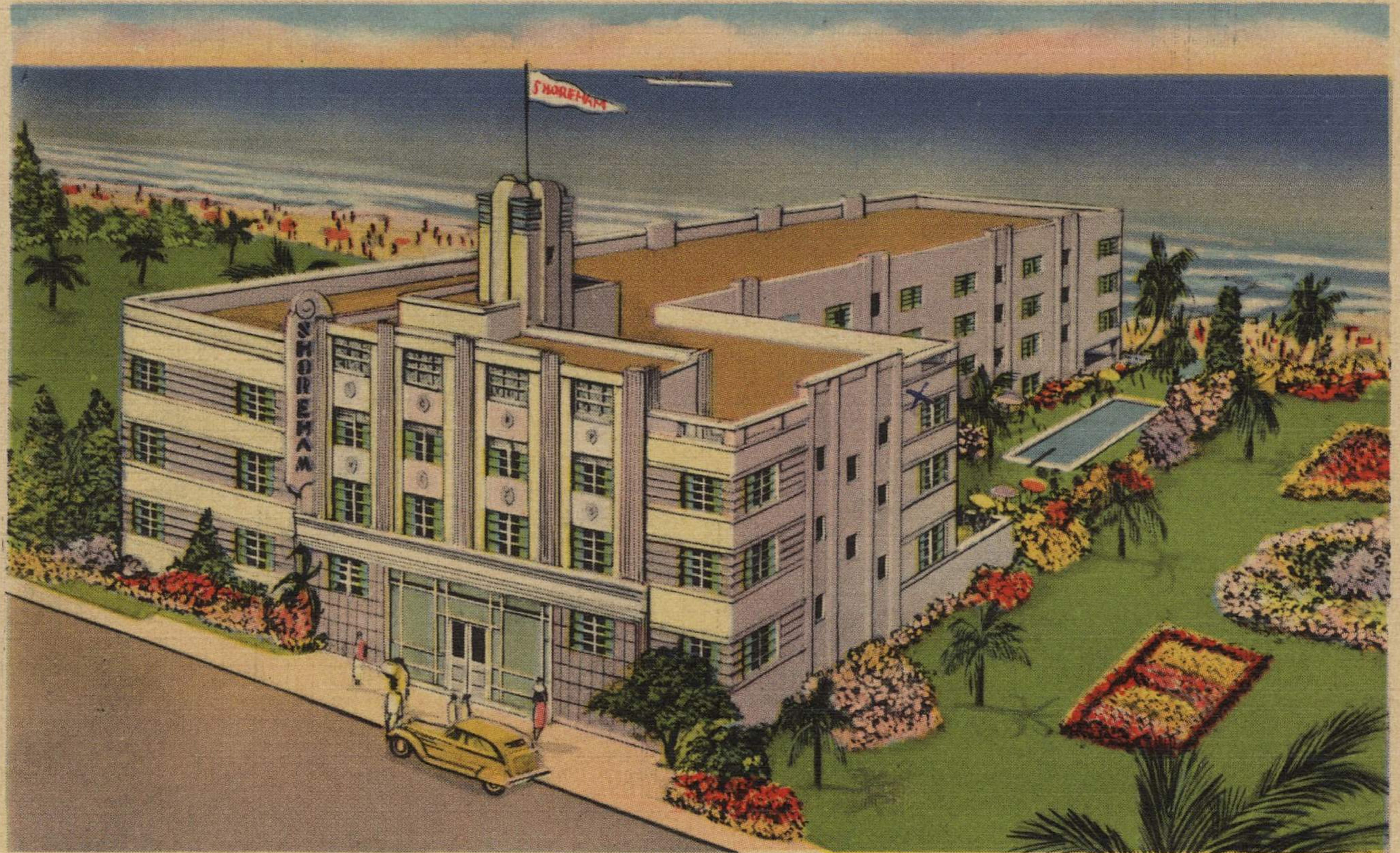
