

Goeffler Shares Laurels

Captain Dick Fitzgerald, the game's high scorer with 13 points, was by far the outstanding Fordham performer. Sophomore Max Loeffler contributed shifty floor work. It appeared that the Kingsmen were in better physical condition and in the final minutes it was obvious that the Maroon players were tired.

A see-saw opening half, which wound up with Brooklyn on top, 18-16, after the lead had alternated from time to time, gave evidence of what was to follow. What little finesse was shown in this fast-moving fray came from the Kingsmen. Approximately six minutes from the end Loeffler and Babich came through with a pair of field goals that brought the Rams the lead at 32-31, but for the rest of the way the losers were limited to a single field goal by Sherry, a spectacular one-hand effort from the side of the court.

An angle set shot by Bernie Gussoff sent the Kingsmen ahead at 33-32. Then Kasner hit the target in a fine pivot play and Lou Lubin added a free throw that made it 36-32. At this stage Sherry broke through. Then, as Fordham strove desperately to regain possession, Joe Hershkowitz curled in the clincher.

In the preliminary encounter the Fordham cubs overwhelmed the University Club of Leonia, N. J., 56-21.
