I also did not realize that high school work entails so much P.E. work in the late afternoon. I was thinking perhaps that you could get away sometime after lunch, around 3:30. That is the time I put the boys to bed and that is when I would have my talk with you.

Doubtless you will be coming to Lawrence or I may be on a speaking tour either to Abilene or Salina and somehow we will try to arrange a time that we can talk over the possibility of your being with us this next summer.
