Dear Emery:

I have just talked with Mr. Earl Falkenstien in an effort to have him fix you up for tickets for the Missouri game.

As you know, a new policy has been adopted to not give complimentary tickets only in exceptional circumstances. Mr. Schwahn received a generous allotment for the Granada, and Mr. Falkenstien is of the opinion that the athletic committee will not enlarge upon the offerings already given.

I am sorry, but you can understand my position. I am happy to do what I can for you, but this is not in my power.

Mr. Falkenstien states that Thursday morning there will be seats in the stadium selling for \$1.10 which will be in the north end. Other seats right near there in the north end will sell for \$2.24. I would advise that you buy one of those tickets early Thursday morning and enjoy just as good seat as the others who will pay \$2.24.
