Dear Louie:

Thank you for your circular letter of the 8th instant. I sincerely trust that it will be possible for the Big Six coaches to meet on Sunday morning, December 10, at 10 o'clock.

As I told you, we are playing at Warrensburg dedicating their field house on the 8th, and if you play on the 9th that will make your schedule agreeable. Certainly none of the coaches should have a conflict on the 10th for our interpretation meeting.
