

4. Resolutions.

The committee reported resolutions of appreciation for all who had worked to make the District Conference a success, and for all the speakers.

Regarding finances, the resolutions adopted provided

I that \$700.00 be retained in the district Conference fund which shall be invested in U. S. Government bonds;

II that \$100.00 be appropriated each year for the expenses of the District Governor in attending the Rotary International Convention;

III that \$200.00 be appropriated each year to assist in financing a student from Latin America, and that a committee consisting of the presidents of the clubs at Lawrence, Manhattan, and Emporia be a committee to determine the details, and that the students alternate annually at the schools in Lawrence, Manhattan, and Emporia.

IV That any surplus be invested in U. S. Government bonds and held for use in aid to clubs outside the United States.
