With those two weeks out, and our Christmas vacation beginning on Saturday, December 17, continuing until January 2nd, this takes about thirty days out of our playing period.

Will you be kind enough to send me your exemination period and vacation dates so that we can run over those things before we make our schedule? However, we are so close to each other that personally I think we can nicely arrange to play on any day of the week. As far as we are concerned I prefer not to play here on Friday and Saturday night as the jelly-beans always have a big schedule mapped out on those two nights.

The fact that we play at 7:30 and get our games over early permits us to drive back in a reasonable time so that we can get to bed without losing much more sleep than the ordinary college student loses on most any week-day nights.

I believe that we have played for three years at Lincoln our second game in the playing season with you. We have drawn well and I believe that Kansas-Nebraska will draw pretty well any time we meet. You are getting your crowds educated so they will come out and see a basketball game most any time an attraction is put on that will warrant a lot of interest.

What would you say to our playing Nebraska at Lincoln on January 14, and Nebraska playing at laurence, Kensas, on say February 14, or scaemhere around there? Dear Dr. Allen:

When in Lawrence yesterday with the golf and tennis teams I was kept busy near the courts and never had an opportunity to see you. Let us try to get together before the basketball schedules are set and try to arrange approximate dates which will be satisfactory.

Comparison of our two university examination schedules shows a conflict. We start on Saturday, January 21, and run until Saturday, January 28, white you don't start until the 26th and finish on February 2. It looks as if sometime before January 21 will be required. As a date for some conisderation I am suggesting Wednesday January 18.

Our indoor track schedule list the Big Six meet as Friday and Saturday, March 3 and 4. I believe that those dates have not yet been accepted by the directors, but those are the ones proposed by Don. Thinking that it might add to your convenience I suggest that our game here be played on Thursday, March 2.

We can make our decision at Lincoln, but am sending these dates for you to be thinking over.

Dear George:

I am just wondering, prior to our meeting at Lincoln next Friday, May 20, when would be the best time to play our two basketball games. Perhaps an exchange of ideas between us before we get to the meeting might help us, as Missouri and Kansas have always scheduled games late in January and late in March.

I believe it is our time to play over at your place last, so we would like to have <u>Missouri here</u>, if possible, on <u>January 25</u>. Our examinations start on January 26, and I would like to have this game just before examinations, if possible. I find we have a very long examination period - January 26 to February 2 - and them our enrollment does not begin until February 6 and 7, and classes begin on the 5th. So we have a long two-weeks period in there.

It will be necessary for us to start playing early in January and play as late as possible to enable us to get in any sort of a home schedule before the holidays.

Another question - are you finishing your season on March 3 or 4, or 10 or 11? Of course, if the Big Six track meet is on Friday and Saturday we would be forced to play on Thursday, and that would be on March 2 or 9.

I thought if you would drop me a line regarding your desires it would help us in our tentative schedule; at least, in planning something. I realize that we cannot schedule games before the meeting, but I think it is well to have a general understanding. Will you please send me your examination dates, and so forth?


