Went to Harvard for further training, and also took postgraduate work at the University of Vienna.

In 1935-36 went to India as Ophthalmic Surgeon at the British Hospital at Shikarpur, India.

Married Geraldine Olson, who was secretary to the dean of the Medical School at the University of Nebraska. Has two sons, Lyle, Jr., and Robert.
