THE HERALD'S BOX SCORING

As you will notice, The Herald's method of publishing box scores is much more complete than the ordinary method.

The player's number is given first, then his last name, with initial or first name if there are other players with the same last name, and the position played: forward, f; center, c; guard, g.

The five columns of figures are as follows:

G—Field goals made. Ft-Free throws made. F-Fouls committed. Mg—Field goals missed. Mft-Free throws missed.

To compute the total score simply multiply Gx2 and Ftx1, | up to par. and add together.

To compute the percentage of attempted field goals made by any player or team, divide G by the total of G plus Mg.

To compute the percentage of attempted free throws made by any player or team, divide Ft by the total of Ft plus Mft.
