New Plant Design Adds Speed To Company Service

Building Provides Ample Space For Paper Storage

Functionalism is the architectura keynote of the Carpenter Paper Co., new home at 860 Northwest Second

It was designed and built to serve the peculiar needs of a business which deals in vast quantities of bulky and weighty merchandise. And paper, however feathery a sheet or two may be, takes on weight rapidly when you deal in reams and truck loads and carloads and train loads.

The Carpenter plant was designed by Sorey, Hill and Sorey, local architects, after a long study of the company's needs. The latest paper plants elsewhere were inspected; and with this data and from Carpenter's notations on what it wanted the designers went to work.

The main warehouse has numerous features planned especially to simplify work. Practically all stock comes in by rail and is unloaded by gravity 1906 Northwest Seventeenth street. from freight cars set on the company's own siding. Steel chutes carry here is H. G. Bauers, who started as manager. The first headquarters had bundles down to the main warehouse floor where they are stored until time for shipment to customers.

Natural Lighting Available This eliminates a lot of elevator and trucking handling. The warehouse has natural lighting, a sawtooth skylight arrangement letting in plenty of north light without the glare and heat of direct sunlight.

The truck loading docks are on a level with truck beds to facilitate this phase of the handling, and an intercommunicating system links all parts of the warehouse with the front office. The whole plant has an automatic fire sprinkler system.

Construction contract on the plant was signed last November 4, and the company moved in from its old Grand avenue headquarters the second week in May. Ellis, Nicholson and Cramer were the general contractors.

Rare Early Papers Made Valuable Gifts

In its infancy, paper was such a rarity it was deemed a valuable gift. There is a legend that Henry Wetmore, who built the first paper mill west of the Allegheny mountains in 1830, celebrated the completion of his task by getting married. For a wedding present he gave his wife a bundle of newly made paper, and she was the envy of all the women in the neighborhood.

'Raggs and Ropers'

In 1763 the owners of a mill in Massachusetts petitioned the court and described their work in making paper and employing people "in picking up raggs and ropes of which paper is made" and asking a bounty for their "encouragement of this mys-

Started in Omaha, Business Has Grown To An Empire Now Busy in 17 States; Sons of Founder Continue in Control

Most successful businesses are the lengthened shadow of one man-a fact which has been recognized and commemorated by epigram and story for a long, long time.

Other men have an important part, to be sure; but somewhere along the way-often in the beginning, sometimes lateris one man whose vision, ability and energy lay the foundations of a great institution. In the case of Carpenter Paper Co., the man was the late Isaac W. Carpenter.

The senior Carpenter founded the business and was its guiding light for almost 50 years. Ill health forced him into semiretirement a few years before his death in 1925, but he took a keen and active interest in business affairs to the last. One of the hallowed rituals in

the Carpenter organization for years was the founder's annual The Company Seal letters to all his subordinates, sent out on each anniversary of his entry into the paper business. The last one was written July 14, 1925.

In the previous 49 years he saw the small paper sales company h started grow to a dominant position in the middle and far west. And his policies and managerial talent were largely responsible.

Carpenter was born on a farm near Marengo, Ill., in 1856. The family was large-six sons, two step-sons and a daughter in addition to the two hardworking farm parents. His early days were typical of any farm boy's life. He carried his share of the farm load, and in later years attributed much of his success to the rigorous environment which taught him to work hard—and enjoy it.

> The original Omaha location was quickly outgrown and in 1889 the Carpenters moved into a five-story building equipped with a power elevator—which in those days was a hallmark of progress and prosperity. This second location served until 1906, when the company built a modern eight story building in downtown Omaha from which it has operated ever since.


> Meanwhile, the firm had been branching out in other directions. Paper is a bulky commodity that requires storage space pending its processing into the myriad shapes and sizes demanded by the consumer. The Carpenters early saw the advantage of warehouses at strategic points in their territory, and in the natural course of events began acquiring them. A Des Moines branch was opened

in 1896 with George Carpenter as manager, and the Kansas City Paper House was started in 1902 with Brother Jim in the driver's seat. A branch was opened in Lincoln, Neb., in November, 1906, and the company got started in Oklahoma in 1908 when a salesman opened a small warehouse in Guthrie. Oklahoma headquarters was transferred to Oklahoma City in 1916, and the Carpenter Paper Co., of Oklahoma was incorporated in July, 1931. Mergers and Expansion

Thus it went. The San Antonio Paper Co., was organized in July, 1913, to serve south Texas. A merger with Carter, Rice and Co., of Denver in 1905 established them firmly in the Rocky mountain area. The Carpenter Paper Co., of Utah was formed in January, 1910, with headquarters at Salt Lake City, although Carpenter had operated a distributing point in Salt Lake City as early as 1903. Sales were made on the Pacific coast







Then, from their nearest stockroom they ship him a thousand sacks, or half a million, or whatever



Company Has Had A Long Record of Service To Middle West

Into North Texas Since then there have been acquistions of other competitive houses; the senior Holland has died and his son, Kenneth, is now vice-president and manager of the Carpenter west coast

Latest major acquisition of the Carpenter domain has been in north Texas. The firm was well established in south Texas as early as 1913, but not until 1935 did it get into the Dallas-Fort Worth area in earnest. In June of that year it bought out a competing organization, the Tayloe Paper Co., of Memphis. The Tayloe brothers, incidentally, began their paper career in Omaha in 1903, but soon moved over to Tennessee and their paths did not cross with the Carpenters again until the north Texas deal was started.

All in One Company

The Carpenter Paper Co., of Texas was organized with headquarters in Fort Worth, and since then additional warehouses have been established in Lubbock and Dallas.

In 1937 all of the assets of the 14 subsidiary companies were liquidated into one organization, the Carpenter Paper Co. Thus, the Carpenter empire now extends through 17 states west of the Mississippi river and serves this vast territory with warehouse stocks of merchandise in Omaha, Kansas City, Oklahoma City, San Antonio, Fort Worth, Dallas, Denver, Salt Lake City, Los Angeles, Lincoln, Billings, Great Falls, Grand Island, Sioux City, Des Moines, Harlington, Austin, Ogden, Pocatello, Topeka, Lubbock, Pueblo and Albuquerque.

While policy and central management is settled at Omaha, each subsidiary has a local operating staff which identifies itself closely with local interests. Each company personnel takes an active part in civic and community affairs; each branch supports local projects and builds itself into the life of the territory from which it obtains its trade. Purchases for each office are made locally so far as this is possible.

Moser Active in City

In Oklahoma City, for example, Ralph R. Moser, the manager, has been one of the most active workers in the chamber of commerce. He has been a director, chairman of numerous committees, and a reliable workman in the ranks whenever help was needed. Moreover, he has been active in Rotary and has served as president of both the Oklahoma City Wholesalers and Manufacturers association and of the Oklahoma Paper Merchants association.

This civic activity is typical of the Carpenter organization everywhere. Company executives are encouraged to |give time and effort to worthwhile civic endeavor. The various branches carry their share of the financial obligations arising from community funds, chambers of commerce, etc. Young Men Are Trained

Each year a carefully chosen group of young men is brought into the organization and started on a rigid training regime which eventually will fit them for the executive positions of the future. The company has through this system now built up a reservoir of potential executive talent from which it can draw its future managers as time requires.

All the present executives of the company have come up through the ranks and have long service records with Carpenter.

J. A. CARPENTER, chairman of the board, has been active in the paper business for almost three decades. He was born on a farm in Marengo, Ill., and started selling papers on the streets of Chicago in June, 1884. He drove a horse and wagon all over the south side and built up a steady business for those days. In February, 1887, he gave up his Chicago business and moved out to Omaha where his brothers already had laid the foundations of the Carpenter company. He served as city salesman in Omaha until February, 1902, when he was sent to Kansas City to take charge of the subsidiary Kansas City Paper House. He retained this connection until December, 1925-when his elder brother, Isaac died. J. A. succeeded Isaac as head of all the Carpenter interests and when the Carpenter Paper Corp., was formed in 1930 he became its president. He was named chairman of the board in April, 1936—the position he

still holds. I. W. CARPENTER JR., is president. From his Omaha headquarters he directs the merchandising and operating activities of the entire Carpenter group. He came into the paper business in 1916 as a city salesman and became active in the manufacturing and merchandising departments. He soon was made manager of the Federal Envelope Manufacturing company, one of the Carpenter subsidiaries. He continued his merchandising and sales work in the fine paper department and in 1926 became vicepresident of Carpenter Paper Co. of Nebraska. In 1930 when the Carpenter Paper corporation was formed he was elected first vice-president and later.

How Is It Made? Trees-to-Presses Is Absorbing Tale

Vegetable Fibers Are Base for All Paper; Process Is Intricate

All paper is made from vegetable fibers. Trees, cotton, flax, jute, straw, esparto, sugar cane, cornstalks, hemp, bamboo and many other plants and grasses are used, but the finest quality paper comes from pulp of which spruce is the base.

The fibers of the spruce wood are strong, uniform and have been found to be best adaptible to paper making. About half of a spruce log is usable fiber in a paper mill. The rest is lignin and other binding agents which must be removed. It is the job of the pulp mill, usually located near the forests, to separate the usable fibers from the rest of the wood. This is done by various "cooking" processes involving use of dissolving agentsusually sulphites and sodas.

Cut Into Chips After the bark and knots have been trimmed from a log, the wood is fed into enormous machines which cut it plant which constituted the body of required thickness. up into small chips. These go into great retorts called "digesters" where the "cooking" process soon dissolves, washes and drains away everything but the wood fibers. The result is

paper pulp. Pulps usually are blended at this point in accordance with the particular grade of paper wanted. Pulps of various kinds can be mixed much as tobacco, coffee and whisky are blended to improve flavor, aroma, etc. Modern paper mills have extensive laboratories and research staffs which constantly experiment with new blends and mixtures.

Many More Processes Pulp is paper, but it isn't yet ready for commercial uses and must go through other intricate processes before it is in condition for the trade. The paper mill does this job.

Pulp fibers go through machinery which soaks them so thoroughly each fiber virtually is swimming around by itself. To help out in this, the mushy solutions go through "beaters" which crush and stir the pulp in great tanks and between iron "ribs." The pulp is flattened, frayed, beaten and otherwise maltreated.

Paper makers say paper is "made in the beater," which means its ultimate quality is determined by how well the pulp is beaten. In the beaters, too, color is added to the pulp if the finished stock is to be "other than natural white. "Size," that is waterproofing so the paper will take ink, is also added here, as are various fillers -china clay, fuller's earth, starch,

Bleached by Chlorine Bleaching is sometimes done in the beaters, although many pulp mills do it. Chlorine is the principal bleaching agent and it turns the pulp from its natural yellowish tinge to the plain

white most paper must be. The real miracle of paper making comes about in an extremely simple process. It is in the Fourdrinier machine that the watery pulp emerges as

Fourdrinier is probably the most important name in paper making. Henry and Sealy Fourdrinier, two wealthy English brothers, pauperized themselves in perfecting a machine invented in 1798 by a Frenchman named Louise Robert. The latter developed a rough mechanism with a moving wire screen that made a continuous sheet of paper. Up until that time, 1798, all paper was made by hand, one sheet at a time, in wirebottomed moulds.

The Fourdriniers acquired the Roberts patent and worked out a machine which is basically the same to-

Liquid Paper First

"Liquid paper" in the form of pulp which is 1/2 of 1 percent pulp and 991/2 percent water flows onto a moving screen of bronze wire. The screen is 65 mesh and it shakes sidewise as it moves forward. This motion interlaces the fibres and at the same time drains part of the water away through the screen.

The Fourdrinier screen gives the paper its first tentative form—a loosely knit, pulpy and watery mass that has some resemblance to a sheet of paper. It is still about 80 percent water at this point and has just enough tensile strength to jump a short gap from the screen to press. This is another endless belt, made of high grade wool. This belt takes the pulpy paper under rolls which squeeze out more water and compress the paper still more compactly. More Water Removed

The presses take out 10 to 15 percent more of the water and send the paper on to the driers, which are huge metal rollers filled with steam. These dry out all but 6 percent of the water and squeeze the paper into its final, paper-thin dimensions. From the driers it emerges in substantially Its finished form.

Calendars, which are very heavy and highly polished steel rollers, give it a final smoothing and ironing, and then nothing remains but to wind it on reels and process it into the myriad shapes and sizes demanded by modern

Secret Messages Once Kept on Thin Metals


Many curious practices flourished before the popular use of paper. Aeneas Poliorectius, who lived about 720 B. C., relates that women carried secret messages written on small leaden volumes, or rolls of very thin metal, which they wore as earings. These were made pliable by beating with a hammer, and sometimes were sewed into women's shoes to allay suspicion.



Dust and Sand Used To Dry First Ink

It was not until after the Civil war that the use of blotting paper became general. A pewter shaker of dusting to be removed and ordered the subpowder or sand was employed for the "blotting" purposes before then.

The blotting paper industry was born when a careless workman forgot to put sizing in a batch of ordinary rag paper. Distraught over the loss, the mill owner attempted to utilize the paper for his own correspondence, but when he began to write on it the ink spread all over the paper. Then the idea occurred that here was a substitute for sand drying. Thus was blotting paper born.




