I am enclosing copy of a letter I am sending to Donald Burt. I just wanted you to know that he can be assured of a job if he needs it. However, I always advise against the boys working too much, particularly during their first year. There is a good deal of orientation which is necessary in the transfer from high school to college.

Unless a boy is unusually dependable, he may bite off more than he can chew. But I will give him as much work as he can very properly do, if he needs it. Work at 35¢ an hour is a pretty expensive way to spend his time if he fails in his academic work.

I hope that Donald is planning on coming to the University.
