We have no funds to take care of this, as do some of the colleges, and I am afraid this may operate against his coming to the University.

If he could get money for tuition, I am sure that we could give him work that would enable him to make his board and room; that is, if he is the type of fellow who will work and not depend upon his athletic ability as a recommendation for his work instead of his own initiative and his energy.

If you feel that he is the type of boy that might desire an education and is willing to work, I would be happy to help him. Please write me and give me your opinion of this.
