Thank you very much for your kind letter of the 21st instant, and also for the clipping which you enclosed. I am very much interested in Jim Kriss, and would be happy to have him here.

If he is interested in a CSEP (or NYA) job I would suggest that he make application to the secretary of this office at the University. I find upon investigation that students of neighboring states are given consideration along with Kansas students.

I could give the boy a job in the towel room here in the gymnasium at 35¢ an hour, which would help with his expenses. I am asking that a catalog of the university be sent to you so that you will have an idea of the expenses necessary for attendance at K. U. You will notice that the matriculation and incidental fees for non-residents are considerably higher than for residents of Kansas.

What kind of work is the boy qualified to do? If I had this information it would be much easier to place him. I shall be glad to hear from you again. I assure you I very much appreciate your interest.
