Your letter of December 23 is at hand. In reply will state that I believe action already taken by our Conference would permit our athletic teams to take part in such participation as you have mentioned in your letter.

"In view of the National Defense movement, and in the interest of service morale, each Big Six institution be permitted to schedule such competition as it may deem advisable, and that such competition against service teams be not counted as years of participation against members of a varsity, "B" squad, or freshman team, nor against the limitation of existing schedules."

I feel I am correct in stating that our conference would welcome the opportunity of assisting our armed forces in any way in which would be possible for us to render such assistance.





I have just been informed that the "Big Six" has approved athletic contests with Service Teams.

We sincerely hope that you will include us on your basketball schedule and permit us to come to your Institution and play this contest before your student body and fans. Through the medium of this game you will make a definite contribution to National Defense and especially to our Recruiting Program. It is believed such a contest would result in a very favorable impression toward the Navy and create an added interest in the Navy in your community.

Through the medium of these games we hope to raise funds for the Ninth Naval District Relief Society, which organization contributes to the welfare of navy men and their families from the states of Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Kentucky, Illinois, Missouri, Minnesota, Nebraska, Kansas, North Dakota and South Dakota. I know you will be in sympathy with this as well as the other objectives that motivate us in this activity.

The Navy team will be composed of college basketball talent recruited from the states in the Ninth Naval District, and in view of the record and prominence of these athletes it is believed the Navy will have a very strong team. A list of talent on the station is enclosed.



I appreciate, very much, your letter of October 14th, and hope plans can be arranged for the Naval Training Station Basketball team to come to Kansas State for a game this season.


I think it desirable to arrange for a series of three or four games on a trip of this nature in order to reduce the guarantee required. Plans are under way for games with Nebraska, Kansas, and Missouri; and it might be that a schedule could be arranged to play these, or other colleges in your locality, on this trip. Your date of January 28 would be most acceptable to us as our tentative date with Nebraska is January 24. Would you get in touch with Phog Allen, Edwards at Missouri; and Washburn, in Topeka; or other nearby colleges; and see what games could be arranged for January 26 and 27. We would, of course, like to play at Missouri on January 29, as we return east, if possible.

We plan to travel with a party of 18 men, and if at least four games can be arranged; we can come for a guarantee of \$275 from each university, with an option on 50% of the net cash gate.





Dear Mr. Edwards:

I have your letter of October 9th, and am sorry I did not have the correct information concerning the action of your conference in regard to scheduling basketball games with service teams this season. However, I do hope that the action taken at the December meeting will permit us to play Missouri and the other conference teams.

Should these games be approved, I would like to suggest arrangements be made so our team could play both the University of Missouri, and the University of Kansas on the same trip. I have a letter, today, from Phog Allen, and he favors a game, subject to conference approval, if it can be worked in his schedule. Would it be possible for you and Phog to get in touch with each other and agree for mid-week games on successive nights in February. I am enclosing our tentative schedule and any mid-week dates selected in February will be satisfactory. However, I wish you would let me know as soon as you have selected dates in order that we can proceed with schedule arrangements.

I estimate the expense would be \$675.42 traveling with a party of 18. I would suggest a guarantee of \$337.71 from each university, with an option on 50% of the net cash gate. In addition to playing before students and basketball followers, we hope to raise funds for the Navy Relief Society. All funds received from our basketball games in excess of expenses, will be turned over to the society, and we are asking that a statement on this be included in the contract consistent with the enclosed mimeographed copy.

John Lobsiger will report for duty in just a few days, and I will tell him to write you. I met him last summer and he impressed me most favorably. I know he is a fine boy, and will be a grand addition to our talent.



" T H A N K Y O U


May I take this opportunity to express our appreciation to (names of sponsor and competition) and to you basketball fans for making this game possible.

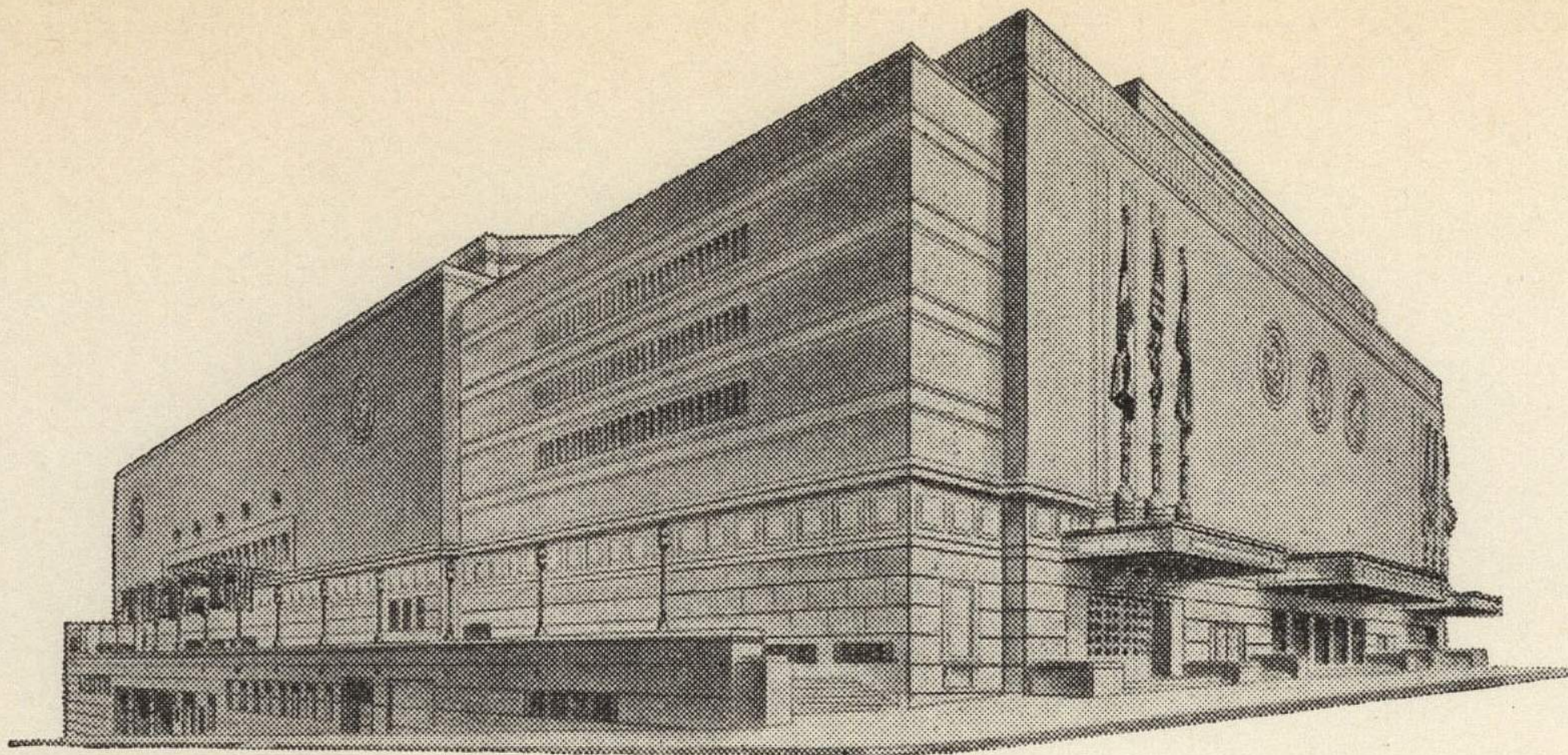



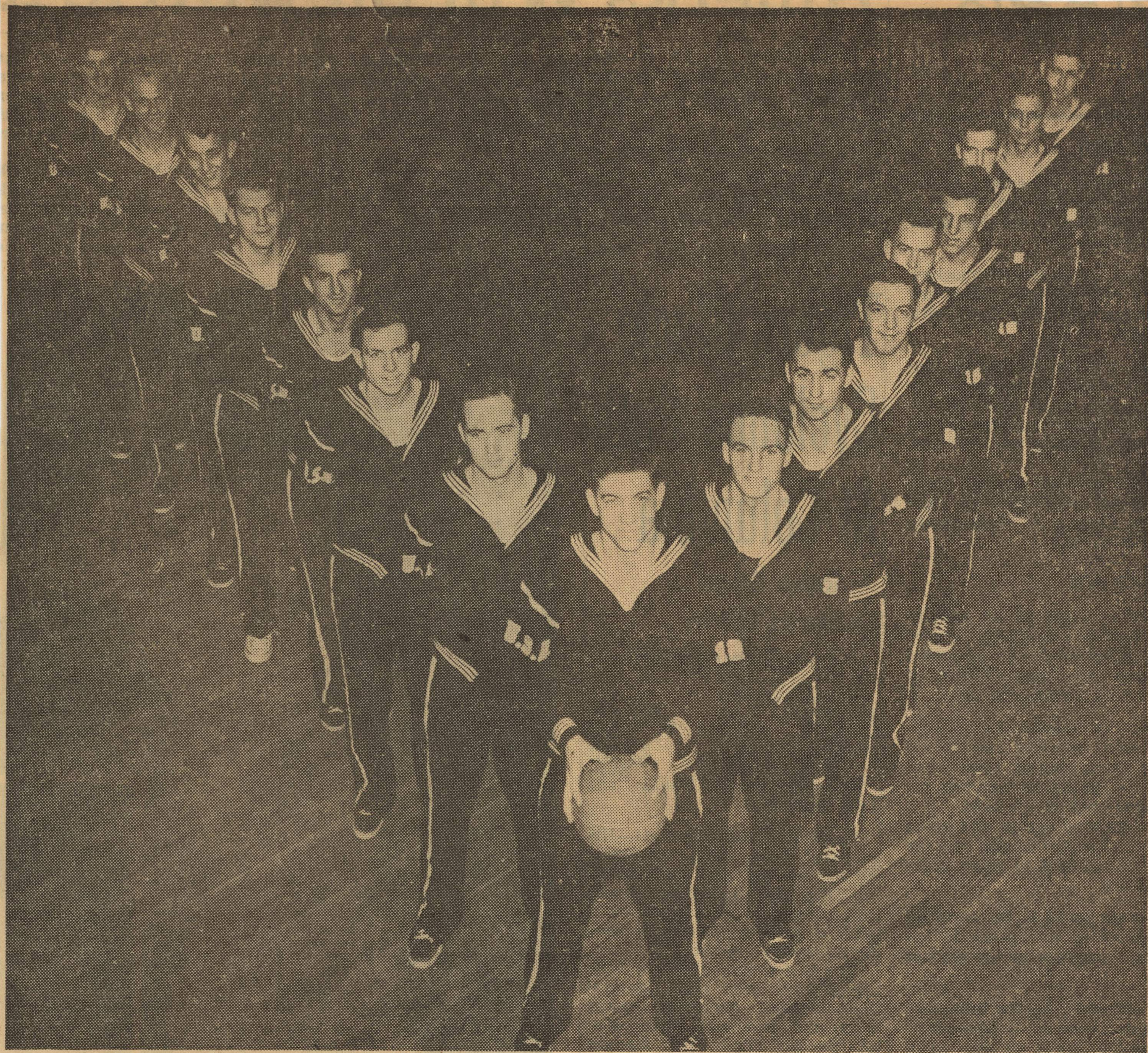

clude Northwestern, Purdue, Indiana and Notre Dame.

Lee Huber, captain of the 1941 University of Kentucky basketball squad, and Johnny Adams, forward of the Arkansas Southwest Conference champions, who were in the N.C.A.A. play-off here last March, joined the squad last night.

Huber's performance as guard won a berth for him on the Chicago Herald-American's All-Star team and recognition as an All-American. He received his B.A. degree in the spring of 1941.

When Huber joined the navy he met another player, Bill Menke, of the University of Indiana, with whom he clashed on the basketball floor last year. The two met as members of winning teams, but when the bout between the two aggregations ended, Menke's team was ahead.
