To Members,
National Basketball Committee:

If the other members of the National Basketball Committee are as nearly up to their ears in details connected with preparations for the current basketball season as is the secretary, they may be interested in some rules comments in a form convenient for use in any meetings which the members may be called upon to conduct. In connection with my regular work in this state, it has been necessary for me to make up some comments on the rules. Some of them are merely routine but also some of them have been dug out and boiled down through the sweat of the brow and the burning of midnight oil. It occurs to me that some of the material might be appreciated by other members of the committee. For this reason I am sending it under separate cover, not because it is anything in the nature of a masterpiece but because it may save some time for members of the committee who will be called upon to discuss the rules.

The material is in the October and November issues of the Illinois High School Athlete which are coming under separate cover. I suggest that you refer to pages 17 to 19 and 20 to 22 in the October issue and pages 34 to 37 and page 39 of the November issue.

Some of the material in connection with the experimental work was made up after consultation with Mr. Allen, chairman of the Research Committee. Other members of the committee can be of assistance if they will give some attention to this experimental work. Quite a number of schools in this locality have already provided for experiments along the lines of those designated.
