


THE FOUR-MAN PASS AND GO BEHIND RECEIVER

The four-man pass and go behind the receiver is a better drill than the three-man drill as it involves four men cutting for passes, gives the men better opportunity for timing, places the men at cutting angles more similar to game conditions and affords an opportunity for the execution of the fundamentals of cutting, passing, stopping, and meeting the ball which are the integral parts of any offensive system.



FIVE-MAN PASS AND GO BEHIND RECEIVER

This drill is a further development of the similar set-up involving three and four men. It is an excellent drill for executing the various offensive fundamentals, but is rather complex and requires considerable time to perfect. However, the complexity of the drill adds interest for the player and has been used very successfully.
