Dear Phog:

The "Y" will be delighted to have you and the only cost will be that for towels when the boys go to the showers. Their physical director, George Gillesby, said to me " Phog Allen is the foremost basketball coach in the country. His teams are always pulling something new. He has written a book on basketball which I have. Will you ask him if it will be OK for some of our boys to watch the team work out ? " So that's how you stand there. I asked him about a work out# on the evening of the 23rd. Their gym will not be available then but I am sure I can get the DAC gym which is less than a block away or if not there are plenty of school gyms, - Wayne University is nearest, e which will be open then.
