Dear Lieutenant Krickhan:

I am sorry that I have not answered your letter of November 16th sooner. I have been out of town and since I have been back I have not been at my desk long enough to dictate. I am still a little worried about our January 16th game in Kansas City. The Auditorium people do not feel that our game with Camp Crowder in Kansas City will justify them leasing the hall on a percentage basis unless we are able to get another team as a drawing card on that night.

I expect to go into Kansas City Monday and will have a conference with the Auditorium people and will write you. This would not keep us from keeping our date at Camp Crowder if we are not able to play in Kansas City.
