Dear Gwinn:

In regard to the expense of the Freshmen Basketball Squad to Columbia, Missouri, February 21st, I am submitting an itemized account of the expense.

Some members of the Athletic Board expressed an opinion that I should not bear the expense of the trip.

The trip was undertaken at my own expense and on the initiation of the Freshmen boys on the squad, so I felt personally liable and of course expected to bear the full expense. However, you stated that you desired a memorandum on the expense so that you could present the same for payment.

If you care do to so, of course, I shall be very grateful. I advanced each boy \$1.00 apiece, or 50¢ for each meal. There were 18 boys.
