Dear Jimmie:

In considering officials for our two games with you here on December 18 and 19, we had thought of using E. C. Quigley and Don Miser, a Notre Dame graduate who is now coaching at St. Benedict's College, for the Monday night game. Apparently Quigley will work only one game a week. In his letter to me of November 23rd he says: "My foot is nearly as good as it was and my leg is getting stronger each day. . . . I may work one basketball game a week, if anyone wants me to operate."

For the second game we had thought of Ted O'Sullivan, a Missouri alumnus who worked in the Orange Bowl football game last year. He is on both the Missouri Valley and Big Six list of officials, working games for both conferences. He is one of the outstanding officials in this section. For the other official I would suggest John Carmody, a Midland, Nebraska, College man, athletic director, football and basketball coach at Haskell Institute for a number of years. Parke Carroll, of the Kansas City Journal Post, also worked in the Orange Bowl game last year and he is one of the outstanding basketball officials of this section.

I haven't found out whether Quigley is available for the night of December 18th. He is in Cincinnati now attending the National League's conclave there.

I wish you would write me at your early convenience and let me know which men would be satisfactory.
