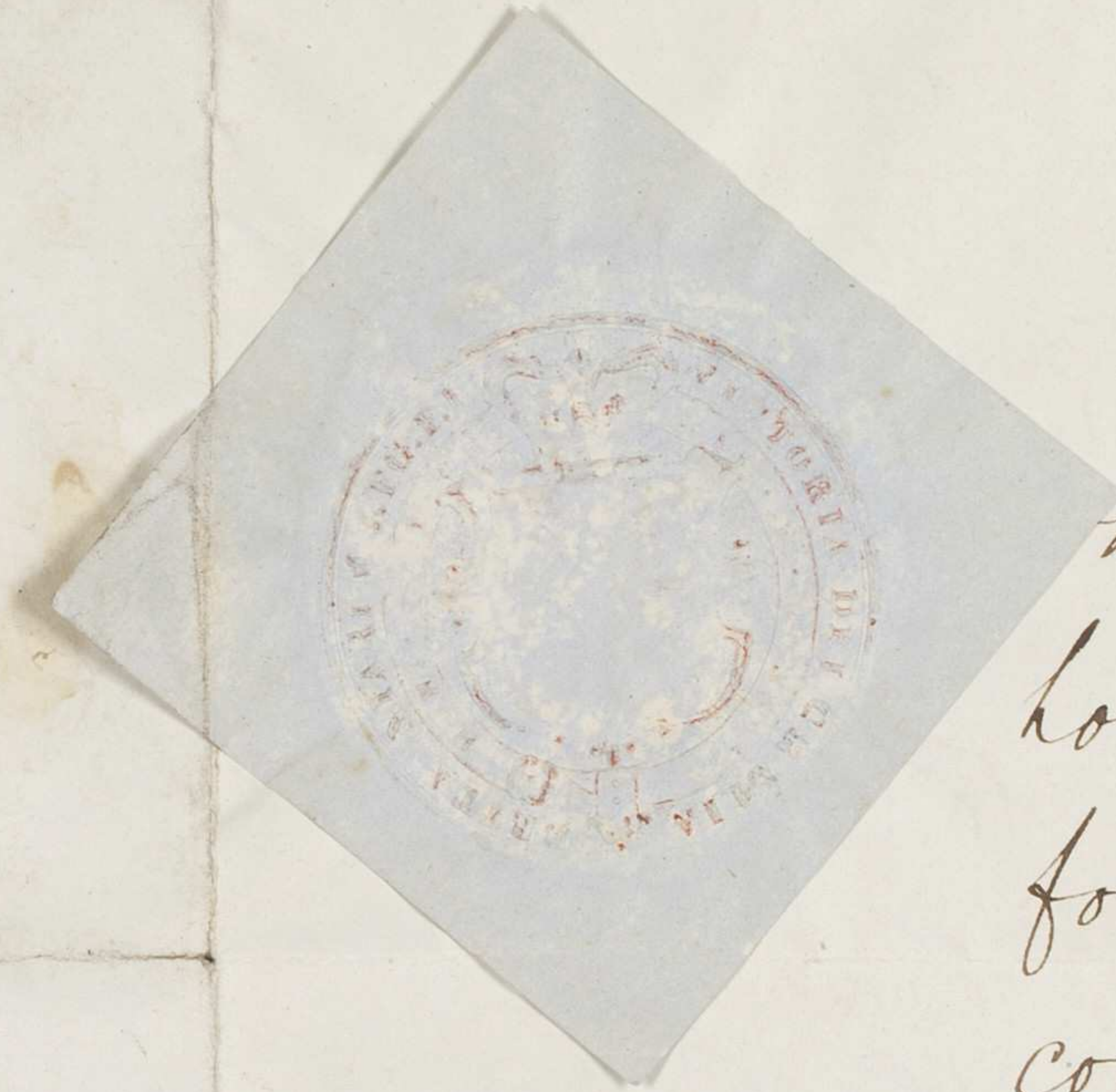

is that you do give the necessary
directions accordingly. And

your Warrant Given at Our
