To Our Trusty and Wellbeloved Lewis Marcell Esq: Greeting We reposing especial Trust and Confidence in your Loyalty
Courage good Conduct and Ability do by these Presents constitute and appoint you to be Director of Engineers upon the
Establishment of Our Office of Ordnance in Our Kingdom of Ireland and to take your Rank as Major of Foot in Our Army. You
are therefore carefully and Diligently to discharge the Duty of Director, by doing and performing all manner of Things thereunto
belonging likewise to observe and follow such Orders and Instructions as you shall from Time to Time receive from Us,
Our Chief Governor or Governors of Our said Kingdom for the Time being, Our Master General of the Ordnance there for the Time being
Our Lieutenant General and Principal Officers of the same, the Chief Engineer, or any other your Superior Officer according to the
Rules and Discipline of War in Pursuance of the Trust hereby reposed in you Given at Our Court at St James the
Twenty sixth day of January 1763 in the Third year of Our Reign
