It looks as if we may, in all countries, be returning to as simpler, saner form of life; returning to basic facts and emerging from the whirling maze of what I always think of as the "metaphysics" of international finance, international money mark-

My affectionate regards to Mrs. Scott and your good self, and I live in hopes that something may bring me to England before very long, when I shall take care not to miss the pleasure of a day with you both at Idbury.
