I offer for publication are to be regarded as supplementary materials - interesting in themselves (& my thinking) but not requiring detailed narrative (wh. c<sup>d</sup> only be, in a great measure, a rechauffe of what I have already written & published.

As to the "revision" & "additions," I sh<sup>d</sup> & not have any serious objection, if the point were definitely proposed to me. But it seems that Unwin finally withdraws, & there is an end of it.

We can now wait until the Re-miscences come out. After that, I am not sure but that it might be best to revert to a suggestion wh. I once made to you - viz: to abandon the Rossetti Papers in their present form (the volume in your hands, & also the 2 later volumes wh. remain with me), & to construct out

of these 3 volumes a book consisting solely of letters written by or addressed to Dante & Christina Rossetti. I can advise further with you when the time comes.
