Dear Sir,

I received with plea-

sure your letter of the 24<sup>th</sup>.

You ask me to inform you in case I sh<sup>d</sup> see that a Bookseller offers for sale any book wh. belonged to my Brother or to my Sister. As regards the letter I c<sup>d</sup> (without waiting for the uncertain chance of a Bookseller) meet your wishes, & I gratify myself in doing so. I will send you by book-post a little verse-pamphlet written by my Father & other Italians, named "Cracovia", 1847. It relates to the tyrannical & treacherous seizure of the small Republic of Cracow, by Russia, Austria, & Prussia -

a public crime about wh. I dare say  
few people at the present day remem-  
ber anything. Christina's name is in-  
scribed upon the pamphlet by herself. I  
take this copy of the pamphlet from  
among several extra copies of family-  
books remaining in my hands. As to  
my Brother, I have not as yet observed  
any volume with wh. I c<sup>d</sup> conveniently  
part. I might possibly come upon one, &  
in such case wd remember your wish.

My elder sister Maria published  
but little other than the "Shadow of  
Dante," wh. serves to keep her name in re-  
collection. She was an exceedingly de-  
vout woman; in 1873 she entered the  
All Saints Sisterhood, & there she died in  
1876.
