With reference to your letter of 6th inst., addressed to H.E. Count Carandini, I am glad to be able to give you news of my dear friend Mrs. Olivia Agresti. I was in Roma last year and up to the time I left, end of November, she was well but considerably aged owing to the somewhat severe hardships she had gone through. During the occupation she stayed at home and did not suffer any personal harm. However conditions are very bad for everybody and naturally it is worse for elderly people. Her morale was very high and she was very busy giving English lessons.

I am surprised you have received no reply to your letters as postal communications with Rome run quite smoothly, although a letter takes a couple of months. Telegrams instead come very quickly. I repeat hereunder her address : Via Ciro Menotti, 35 . Rome.
