Dear Collie: Enclosed is a little more historical data relative to early day life in Hodgeman County Kansas. I may be driving an inverse ratio in thinking you appreciate this hope not anyway. Hope you are all well. We are as well as usual. Oh boy is it hot and is it dry here. No wind to speak of and from ten o'clock until about four it is nearly suffocating the heat is nearly unbearable something unusual here ^{at least} since 1934. While pastures are fair still it is on account of not being pastured heavily an abundance of early moisture. Things are all done here and we expect to move away have a prospect of a job at or near Santa Rosa if it vanishes we will otherwise move to Las Vegas. I guess from what we hear western Kansas has had a plentiful supply of moisture. By the way John Bowman of near Riverside Kansas and Mrs Jimmie Cunningham of near Gray Station both passed away while my visiting you last both came to western Kansas as ever your friend Jess
