I have before me your letter addressed to  
Box A-32.

The ground that we have for rent is at our  
home place on the extreme south end of Vermont  
Street. We have ten acres of ground in cultiva-  
tion, more or less, all of good black soil, but  
with no gumbo.

About nine acres of this ground was in  
alfalfa for six years and was in corn last year.  
It was thoroughly limed before the alfalfa was  
planted and the yield was good.

This ground, in good condition and close to  
paved highways, should bring \$10.00 an acre cash  
rent.

My home is on the extreme south end of  
Vermont Street, a quarter of a mile south of  
23rd. I should be glad to have you look over  
the ground that you may see how good it is.
