Dear Collie:

Am glad you had no chance to speak of the check. Memories in the church rather broke me up for a while, but I came back. I phoned Pat Sunday evening, but evidently the other folk were out, as he did not mention them, so I had no opportunity to speak ~~to~~ Dolph or Marie.

Had a very successful pleasant trip. In fact, I obtained 105,000 more barrels that in March, which indicates that conditions are improving. I expect additional to come out during the month, and know I will get my share from the P I C. Have already started to store against next winters demands, and told the other roads to do likewise as I am not looking for a bed of roses during this year or next.

Mary Jule and the baby were at breakfast and Nick met me at the train this morning. Everything going nicely here.
