Dear Bus: While I have a printed copy, of what presumes to be the statement of the plant at Wymore, Nebraska, as a matter of fact, there is nothing to identify it with that plant. The name Wymore, Nebraska does not appear on the card, and there may be more than one Farmer's Gruin, Lumber & Coal Company in Nebraska. While I presume that it is all right - you must have the matter positively identified. It requires 429 shares to make fifty-one per cent of the stock. Did I understand you correctly to say that you had offered \$70.00 a share, or \$35,700 for fifty-one per cent? Better consult your lawyer as to the kind of a statement you should recuire, to show the present capital worth of the stock of the Wymore plant and its coal yards at Blue Springs. I think that it should be sworn to before a notary. Also, have the company furnish you with an abstract showing title, taxes due and unpaid, and whether the records in the office of the

Clerk of the District Court, show any suits, judgments or liens. He should know what is required to make you absolutely safe in making
