In fitting her mouth little changes are necessary from time to time to relieve pressure, etc. I think you will be pleased with her appearance. On the matter of prices, it just doesn't do any good to complain, and on the whole, I would very much rather do business during a period of high prices than during a period of low prices. We find it much easier now to meet a payroll of close to \$3,000 a week as compared with payments of fifty years ago when the amount was very much less. Business has kept up well with us, but we face unsettled conditions the same as everyone else.
