case. As one drives a car with his radio on, and passes under electric wires he immediately notices the effect of the electric rays on his radio. That is again borne out by the fact that a stiff load of electricity finally peters out if the line is long enough without any power having been turning. Where your office is located, a detector of electric rays would certainly find a continuous bombardment. Not knowing anything definitely about it, but simply acting on suspicion, I think it would be well for you to absent yourself from your office just as much as possible, and to transact your business very largely from your home. This would simply be as a precaution, and while it might be a little inconvenient, it could be done.

I don't know whether we told you or not, that Mr. Drake, or his son, has built a house perhaps a hundred yards South of the street entrance. The only approach now would be through the Drake property. There have been so many small homes and even larger homes built in Lawrence in the past few years, that the town would look strange to you. Here's hoping you will be able to come up and familiarize yourself with it soon.
