Dear Brother Collie:

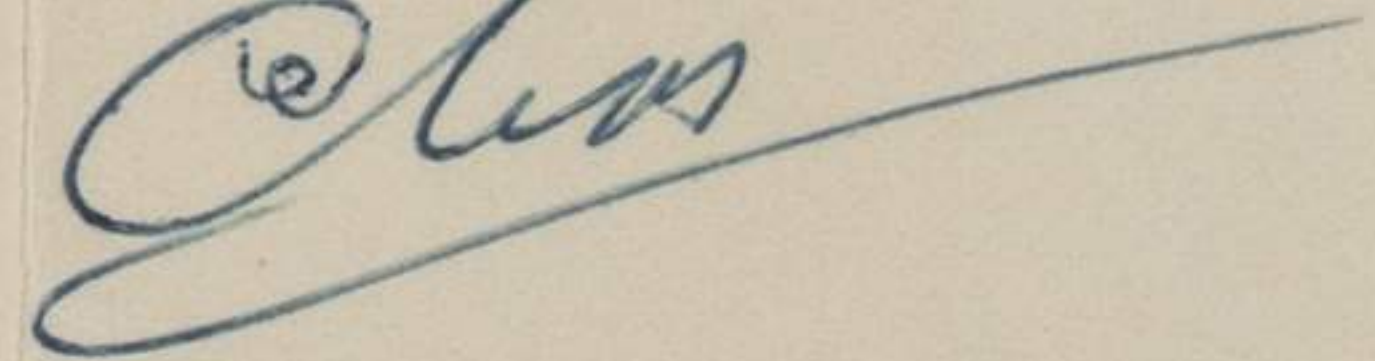
I have written to Dolph acknowledging receipt of his booklet on Germany and Austria, which certainly is well written, and covers the ground.
