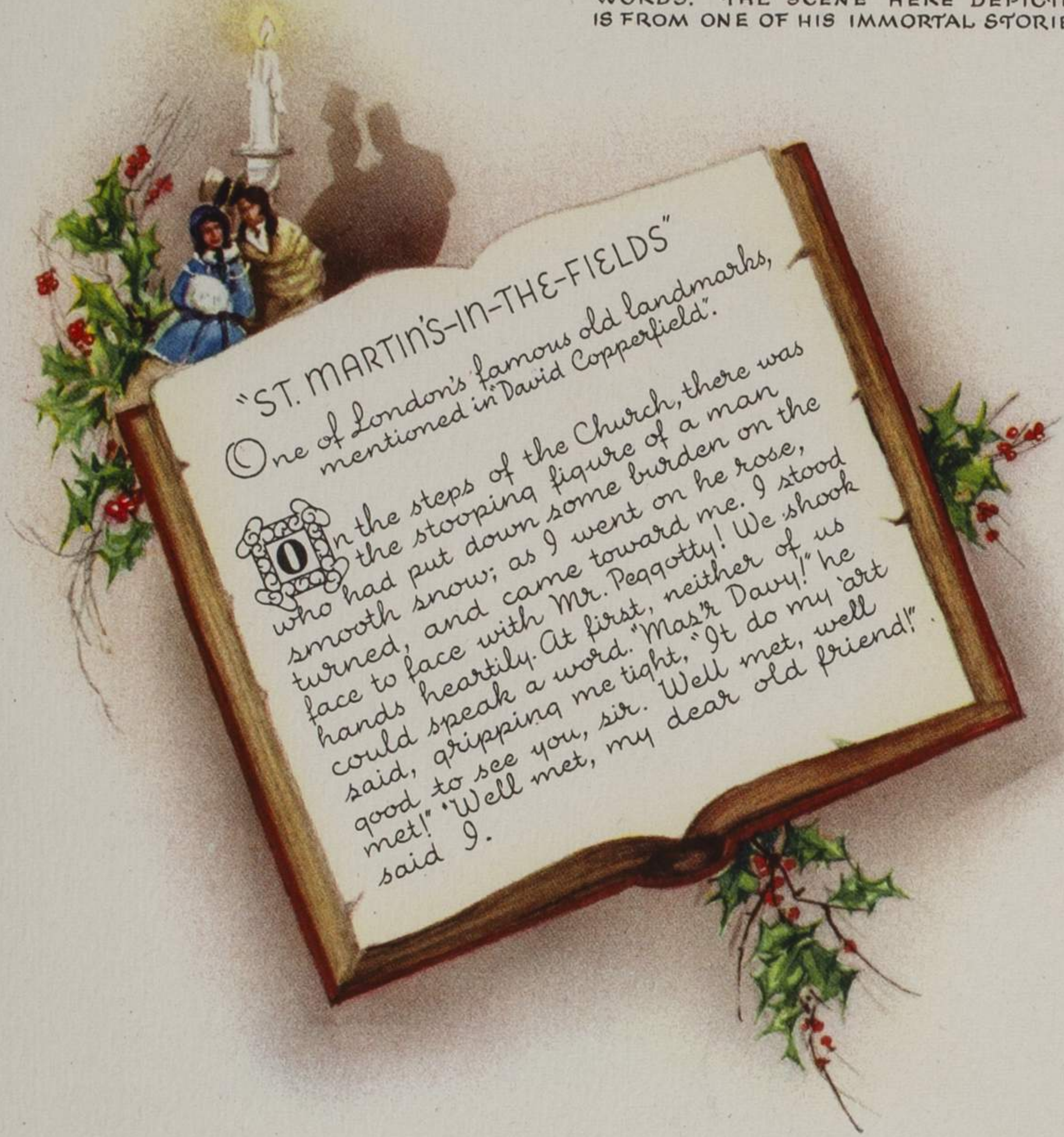


"IT WAS SAID OF HIM THAT HE KNEW
