This has been a good week for your mama. She is eating better and seems stronger and more comfortable. She is not permitted to suffer pain but has not received anything to cloud her mind or interest. We have continued to have a day and night nurse, each serving ten hours so she is without a special nurse only four hours in the afternoon, or evening, from five until nine. Last night I was with her and listened to the radio report of the football game between Lawrence High and Topeka High, which we won with a score of 20 to 0. John played a fine game. It was rather interesting also that Dolph Jr. was called upon to express his views of the game over the radio.

I am expecting Blanche and Janet both for the week end. Last night when Yumma Yugert was being advertised over the radio, Gertrude recalled little Dolph's remark "It's good, Mama, you eat it!"

If nothing unfavorable appears, I believe your mama will be sitting up again soon. She is trying to take it easy.
