When we are back in Chicago Mary and I plan to go to Lawrence for a day and will look forward to seeing you both. We want to see Baby Sally, too.

The summer and autumn have been busy here.

I have worked on the lake front much of the time, and in the community work headed a committee to renovate the town hall next to the school so it could be used to prepare and serve free hot lunches to the school children, there being about 45 children in daily attendance on the average.
