She had another blood transfusion recently and her count now stands at 68 which is very nearly normal. Her color seems to be good and her spirits are good. Her appetite continues to be subnormal which probably is to be expected in one who spends every hour in bed. Dr. Johnson seems to have solved a rather difficult problem of elimination. She takes several shots a day as the doctor does not want her to try to endure pain when a shot does the work. Mrs. Veatch remains as night nurse and a Mrs. McBride comes at seven in the morning. I know that the doctor thinks that she could get along without a day nurse, but she likes her nurse so well and is receiving such careful attention that I prefer to keep the day nurse on for a time at least.
