



That is, you are on my mind a great deal, and I know that Pat is wonderful in his endurance and in his heroic efforts to beat a mighty bad adversary, pemphigus. I had dinner with Carl, Eilene, and Wayne Sunday. Bilene is a good housekeeper and an excellent cook, and I enjoy being with her. They have the cutest and most convenient contrivance for Wayne that I have ever seen. He sits on a seat suspended in the center of a table about 22 feet square. In this way, he can have the full use of his arms and legs and can play with his play things with which he is surrounded. He is just as sweet as ever and I shall miss them very much when they leave for the summer. The new hair which has grown on the fore part of his head is not quite as dark as his babyhood hair, but he is going to have beautiful blue eyes and dark brown hair. When Eilene gets good word from her dad, she is always mighty nice to telephone me. Tell Pat we are all pulling for him and think he is putting up such a wonderful fight that he is bound to win out. You have kept me in key rings so long now that "the memory of man runneth not to the contrary."

It has been two or three days since I saw Wayne and Eileen but both of them were fine when I did see them. He is a wonderful baby and seems to enjoy life.

Many people inquire about Pat and are all greatly interested in his recovery.

I took Margaret and Otis with me yesterday and drove down to Shawnee cemetery to see the graves there. The four wreaths that were put up last fall at the graves of Father and Mother Reineke Blanche and John are all in good shape and have not lost their coloring. I was a little afraid I should find them wind blown. Just across the imaginary line to the north are the graves of George, Max, Earl and Della. George's and Max' being the only graves that are marked.

I wrote Robert in Dallas a year or more ago stating that with his permission I would place a marker at Della's grave either at my own expense or would share the expense with him. He wrote back that he wanted to do it himself, but nothing has been done. Della's goodness deserves more consideration. If it had not been for my acquaintance with Della and our mutual regard, I probably would never have met Gertrude. Her life, unfortunately, was rather hard.

I am glad to give good news regarding little Sallie Stough. I take it that you know that her parents were greatly frightened nearly a week ago, when she fell to the floor, and they saw everything was not right. Calling a doctor immediately she was taken to the hospital, where she stopped breathing, but responded quickly to the respirator. Sje was then taken to the Medical Center at Rosedale where they have given thorough study to her case. It seems tobe a case where first there is some fever, which may be followed by convulsions. Tests for polio and other things of thatsort proved negative, and she will soon behome. Probably by Saturday of this week. So far Mary Jule has been with her, and Vera and her Dad have been keeping house in Lawrence.

It was too close a call to be taken lightly. Here is hoping it will not happen again. She is a beautiful and brilliant child.

I am happy over having the pictures, and they fit into Our photohraph case. Much love to both of you and regards to friends.
