Miss Bayhille was a pawnee, another of the girls whose name I cannot remember was a cherokee, and the third was Miss Putkut, an eskimo born in Point Barrel, Alaska. She had a mongolian cast of features, but was a brilliant young woman. Afterwards I think she went to Washington and it is my impression that she married a white man. We enjoyed having the girls and we remember well that they said it was the happiest vacation they had ever had, and they were afraid it might be the happiest vacation they ever would have.
