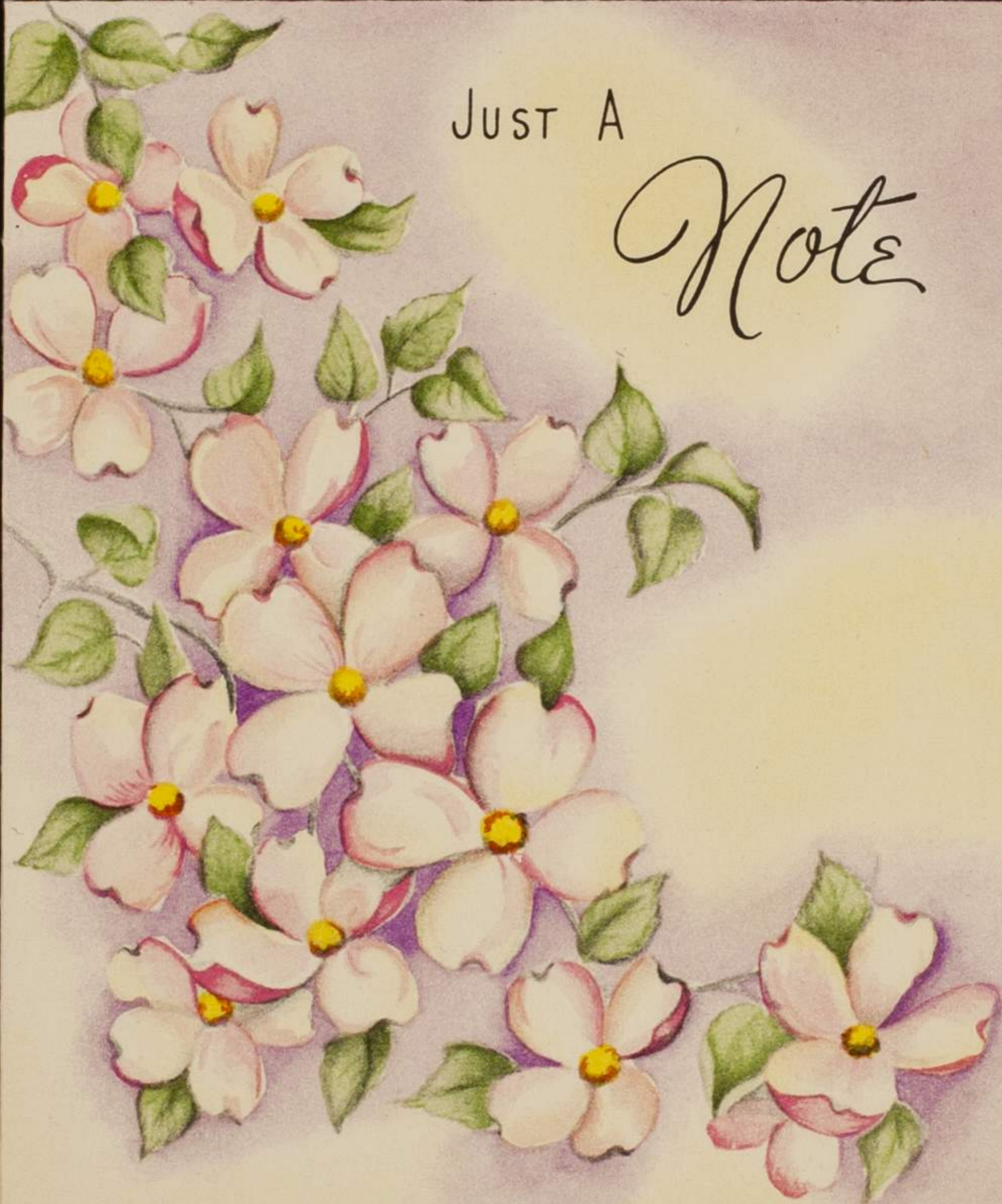

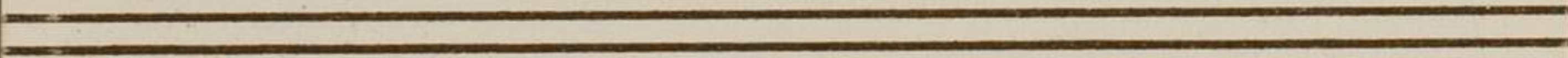

You are probably home by this time and Lawrence never looked prettier. Best of wishes to you and yours.

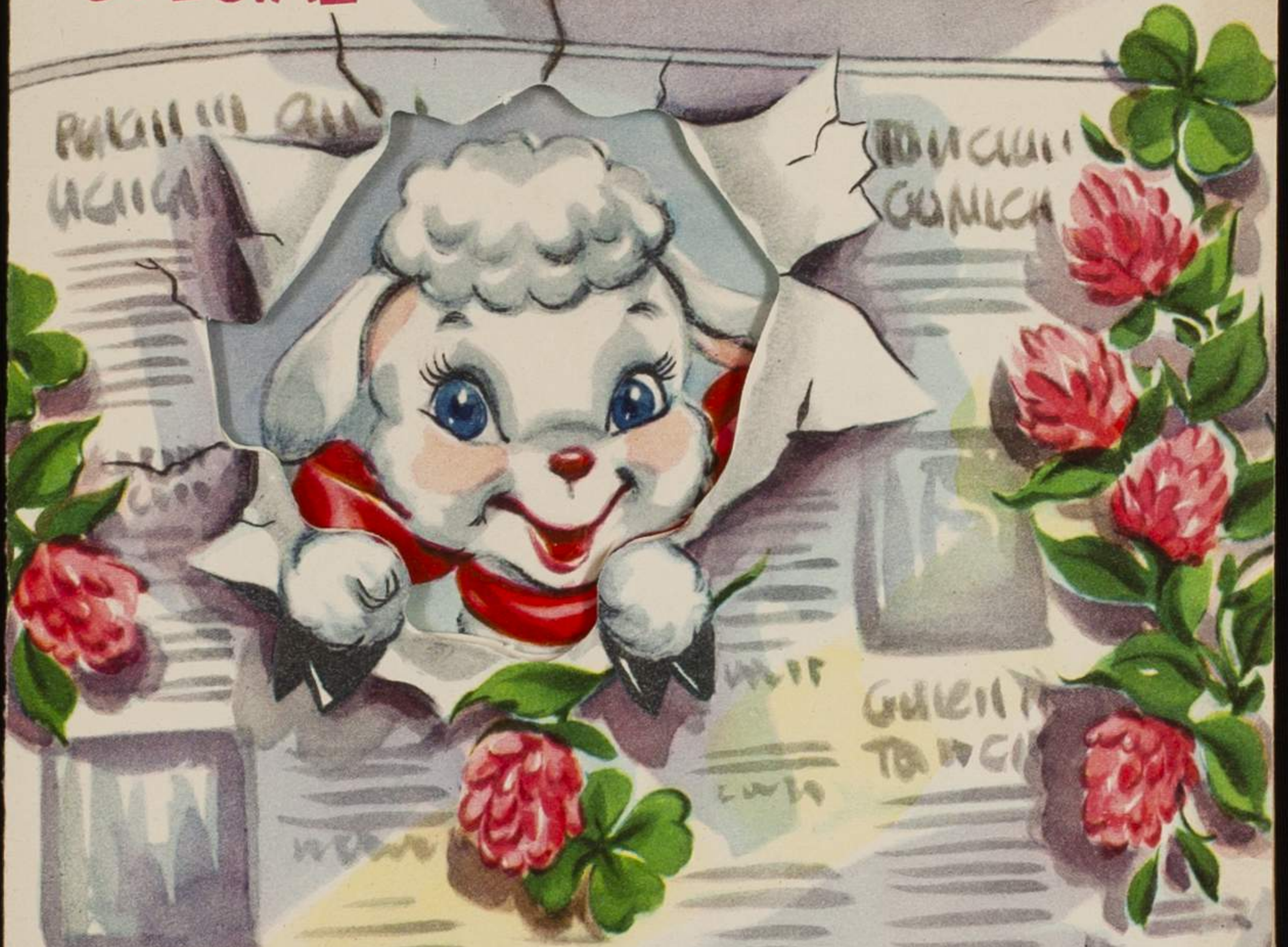

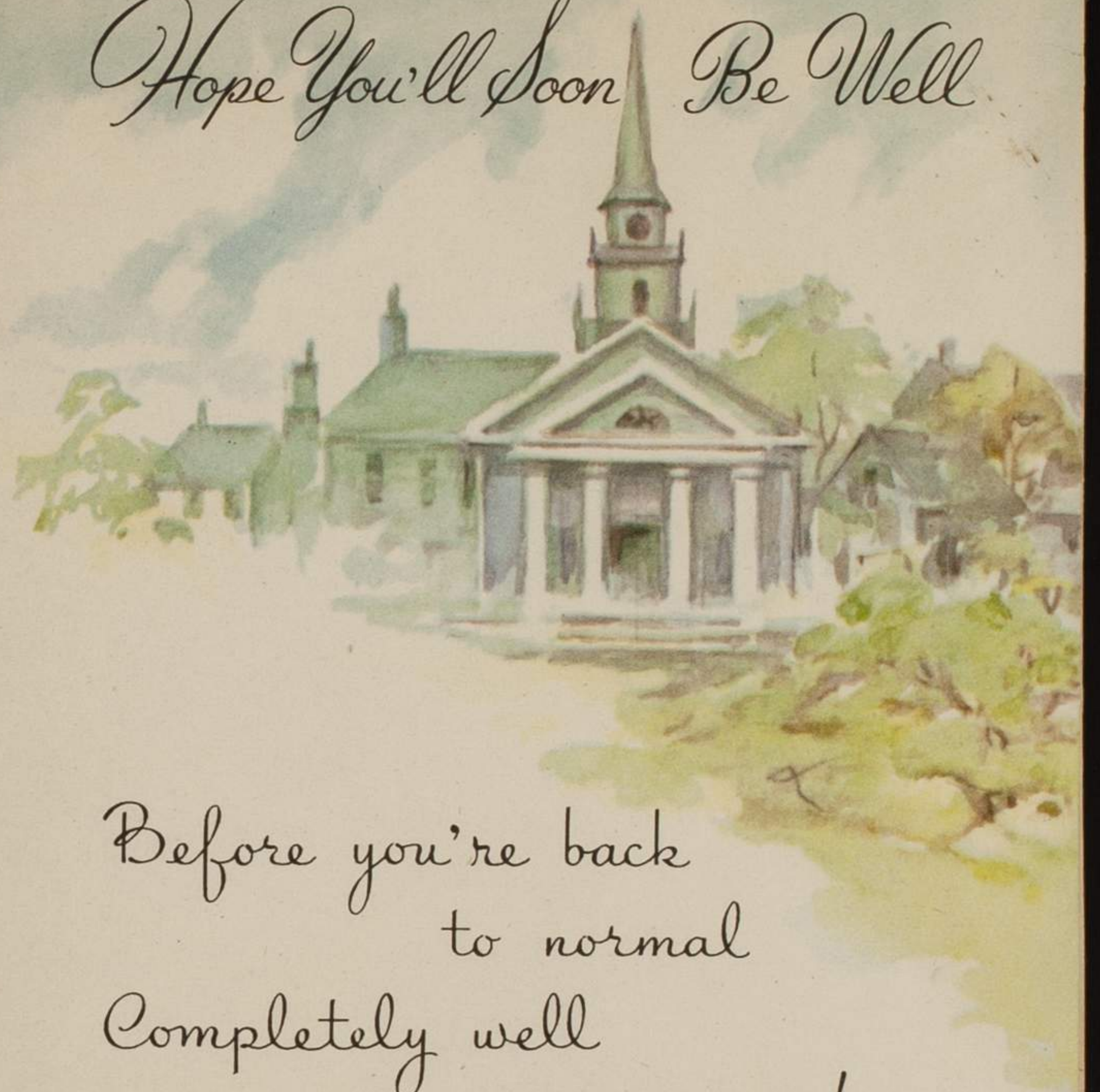

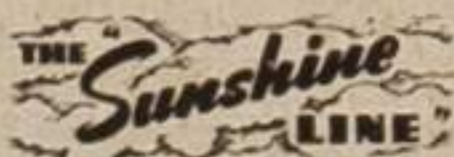
