value to the city, but rather because of the high character of citizenship and superior educational advantages, which gave ideal conditions for erasing the savage and developing the citizen

Lawrence cooperated by raising practically \$10,000.00 with which it purchased 280 acres of land from the late Col. O. E. Learnard and presented it to the government To this other lands were added by purchase until there are about a thousand acres in Haskell farm.

Dudley Haskell died in Washington, Dec. 16 1883, nine months before the opening of the great school which was to bears his name, and which is now the greatest Indian school in the world.

when the school opened in September 1884 it # had for its first superintendent a real educator in Dr. James Marvin, who for twelve years had been chancellor of the state university. The ideals implanted in the school by Dr. Marvin have never, and will never, be lost.
